



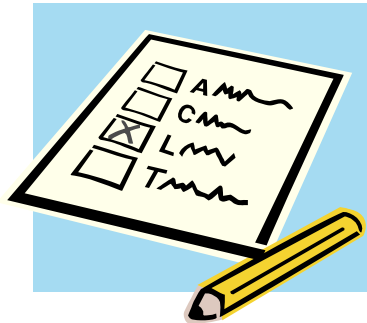

2009 Election Information

The City will hold a municipal election on November 3, 2009, for the position of Mayor (4-year term) and two City Council positions (4-year terms). If needed, a primary election will be held on September 15, 2009.

Please take note of the following information regarding elections:



Declaration of Candidacy

The filing period for those interested in running for Mayor or a City Council position is July 1 through July 15, 2009. Candidates must be a registered voter and a resident of the City for 12 consecutive months prior to the election. Candidates must also submit a Nomination Petition with signatures from 81 registered voters of Highland City (forms available starting now at the City Records Office). Nomination Petitions and Declaration of Candidacy MUST be turned in no later than 5:00 p.m. between July 1 and July 15. The City Offices are closed on Fridays.

Voter Registration

Please be sure you are registered to vote! If you have changed your address, even within the City, it is necessary to re-register. The County no longer has satellite registration, so you must use a mail-in voter registration form (available at the City office or on the Web) or register in-person at the Utah County Elections Office.

Poll Workers

If you are interested in serving as a Poll Worker in this year's election, please contact the Records Office at 801-772-4506 or download an application online. Full day positions for poll workers (\$85/day), or partial day for counting workers (\$45/day) are available. Must be 18 years of age and a registered voter in Utah County.

The schedule finishes off Friday evening with the Ranch Rodeo. 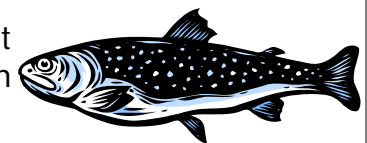
