August will bring many exciting changes along the entire length of the Utah Department of Transportation's Timpanogos Highway (S.R. 92) project. By the second week in August, the I-15 interchange area will be paved and striped in the new Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) configuration. While not quite complete, motorists will be driving in the new configuration S.R. 92 • LEHI TO HIGHLAND under temporary conditions. Please visit our website and view the animation describing how to drive a DDI. Throughout August, crews will finish barriers, traffic signals, signing and lighting, and raised medians. Please use caution in this area and expect some delays as this portion of the project is completed.

Also in August, many of the side-streets along the corridor, such as the frontage road, Center Street, 1200 East and Tamarack Drive will be completed and open in their final configuration. Although these openings are met with great anticipation, there is one more closure yet to come. Sometime in August, the south leg of Highland Blvd. will be closed to through traffic. During this closure, residents will need to use 1200 East to access the north side of Highland Blvd.

Other work scheduled for the project in August includes: concrete paving throughout the project, asphalt paving in Highland, traffic shifts to new pavement, bridge construction at Center Street, 1200 East and Highland Blvd., and landscaping in Highland.

The Timpanogos Highway project is expanding S.R. 92 from I-15 to S.R. 74 in Highland, to five lanes. Between I-15 and Highland Boulevard, UDOT is augmenting the arterial with "Commuter Lanes," which will provide a direct connection to and from I-15 without stopping at intersections. The project is scheduled for completion in Fall 2011. 2011 HIGHLAND FLING GRAND MARSHALS

We are please to announce that we honor four Grand Marshals at this year's Highland Fling on Saturday, August 6. Our Grand Marshals are Emmett "Cyclone" Davis, Eldon Hinckley, Darwin R. Miner, and Louis Latimer who are all World War II veterans.



Emmett "Cyclone" Davis was born in Roosevelt, Utah in 1920 then moved to Salt Lake where he graduated from East high and attended the University of Utah. He joined the Army Air Corp in 1939 and received his commission as Second Lieutenant on November 1940. After training with P-36 and P-40 airplanes he volunteered to go to Hawaii on the aircraft carrier, Enterprise to deliver 36 of the planes. He was one of the first pilots to take off from the aircraft carrier with only 20 hours training. He became an expert at dog fighting which is how he got his nickname. He was awarded a Silver Star at age 22.

Throughout his career, which included the Korean War, he would get some 20 medals and awards. He retired as a full Colonel in the Air Force and went to work for Hughes Aircraft. There he helped design and test airplanes until he retired in 1983. He and his wife, Margorie, live in Highland with their daughter and son-in-law Pam and Gary Mull. He has three children, 5 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren which include local author Brandon Mull.



Eldon Hinckley, was born in Rexburg, Idaho where he graduated from high school and attended two years at Ricks College where he met his future wife, Ella Mae Gloom, who played in the band with him. They were married before he enlisted in the marines at the end of 1942. He taught at the Naval Communications School in Chicago for over a year. Just as the war was winding down, the Navy phased out their participation in the school and the Marines were scheduled to go into the infantry. After a month of inactivity in Hawaii his unit was sent to Guam then Okinawa then back to Guam. Finally orders came down that he was to be part of the first wave in the invasion of Japan. He knew his chances of surviving were slim and was saddened at the thought about dying and leaving his wife and two children. He spent the last months of the war in Tientsin, China accepting the surrender of the Japanese troops there. After the war Hinckley worked for the United States Post

Office until he retired. He moved to Highland 30 years ago and helped design and build the home he still lives in today. His wife passed away some six years ago. He has five children and said he has 20 or more grand and great grandchildren.



Darwin R. Miner was born in American Fork, he attended Harrington Elementary School and graduated from American Fork High School as World War was in full swing. There was an offer from the military for young men if they enlisted prior to their 18th birthday, they could choose which branch of service they could enter. In 1944 in his senior year of high school, Miner chose the Air Force. He sold his prize hunting rifle to buy an engagement ring for his sweetheart, Bonnie Larsen, in March. He graduated from high school in May and left in July where he was picked to go to air cadet training in Amarillo Texas. When the Air Force began shipping out air cadets as infantry soldiers, Miner anticipated being transferred to the east coast then shipped overseas. He asked Bonnie to come to Texas so they could get married. The couple were married in October 21, 1944 in Alpine, Texas.

After the war Miner took classes in mechanics and went to work at Geneva Steel as a heavy duty diesel mechanic where he retired in 1985. Although Miner's memory fails him now he responds to events from years ago. Miner and his wife have lived in Highland since 1994 and have five children, 28 grandchildren and 26 great-grandchildren.



Louis Latimer was born in 1926 in Salt Lake where he grew up and graduated from South High School. He got a deferment to go to the University of Utah for one year before enlisting in the Navy in May 1944. He trained in Chicago and Seattle in electronic technology. Louis didn't get to see any action, although he was ready and willing. In fact, he was aboard a naval vessel headed for Japan when the war ended. "I was trained to take care of the electronic services on the ship. I was happy to go do my part," he said. "We were part way there when the war ended." When the war ended the ship was reassigned to Alaska where Latimer spent the rest of his service until he was released in May 1946. When he got home he was called on a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints to Guatemala and returned after three years in January 1950. While

on his mission one of his companions from Salt Lake showed him a picture of his younger sister. "I wrote her and when I got home we met and I married Ruth Hansen on Sept 27, 1950," he said. "Ruth died just a few years ago. She was a wonderful woman, involved in musical productions such as Saturdays Warrior." They have six children.
